1. Call to Order

Chelsea Yager for her strong effort from Vail employees in the Mt. Lemmon Marathon. VAIL for winning a planning award from the Pima Metropolitan Alliance for the design of our school.

2. Consent Agenda

Although no copy of the field trip request was provided, Mr. Barger informed the council of Mr. Oden's government classes going to the debate for Congressional District 1. Motion was taken.

3. Old Business

A. Enrollment Summary: Mr. Barger presented the site council with a copy of the enrollment of VAHS and the Vail School District so that council members could compare site enrollment with that of the district. This was an inform item.

B. Override Prop 404: Mr. Barger shared with the site council efforts that groups have taken regarding the proposition. Questions were asked for clarification. The result of the election will have a significant outcome on the district. If it fails Vail will need to cut 45 teaching positions.

C. Parking permits – Mr. Barger presented the site council with a form that has already been filled out in order to register their car and receive a parking permit. The school board has recommended that students be charged a \$10 fee in order to get their parking permit. Mr. Burns motioned and Mrs. Meyers seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

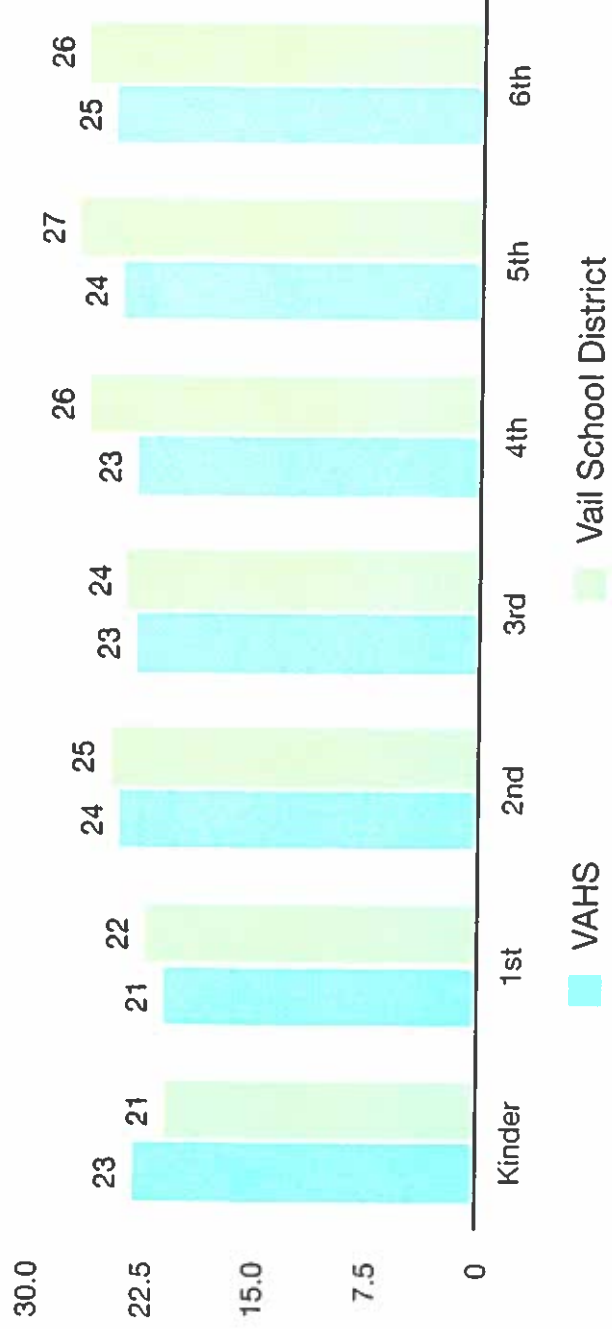

Kindergarten Enrichment

2010-2011 Cost of \$1600 per student

Additional: Decision to reduce from full day to half day was based on the legislature's decision to reduce funding. This happened after families had already been told we would have a program. After a parent meeting and discussions with the 2009/2010 site council a decision was made to charge \$1600 for a kinder enrichment program.

The cost comparison of the VSD's Kinder Cottage program showed the cost at approximately \$2200, or \$600 more than our families paid and our students had more individual time with a certified teacher.

The issue is what is the best price to charge for 2011-2012?

Is Kinder Cottage cost going up for 2011-2012?

Should Kinder-enrich at VAMS go up or stay the same?

Are kids and parents getting their money's worth?

Is VAMS going to add yes?

It is the recommendation of the VAMS administration that the fee assessed for participation in the Kinder-Enrichment program be increased to \$2000 for the 2011-2012 school year.
